# Leaders' Orientation Meeting

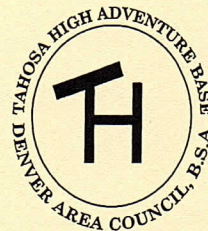
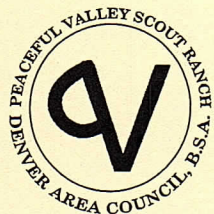

## **ASSESSORS WANTED!**

I am looking for quality people to visit Boy Scout Camps and insure they are in safe operating condition for our youth. Councils include: Rocky Mountain Council, Pikes Peak, Longs Peak ,greater Wyoming, Black Hills Council and Montana. (Denver Area not included because you cannot assess your own council)

Training is a 6 hour course either March 24 in Colorado Springs or April 21 in Denver. Must be approved by Council. The Boy Scout resident camp visitations usually take place on a Tues-Thursday, the week of June 10<sup>th</sup> and excluding drive time ,take approximately 3 hours.

Medicine Mountain, Camp Buffalo Bill and Montana require drive time and an overnight stay. Cub Scout resident camps are 1 day events that take approximately 2 hours.

This is a great way to see how other councils conduct camp, while also appreciating the beauty of the Rocky Mountains.

Please contact me if you are interested or have further questions. Do not let inexperience or special needs issues hold you back from expanding your Scouting horizons.

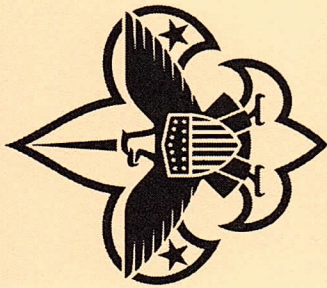

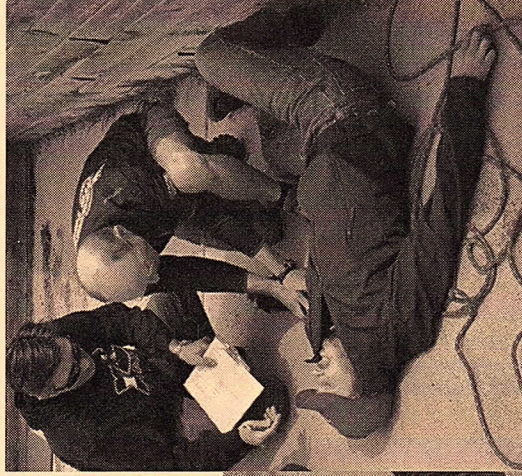
